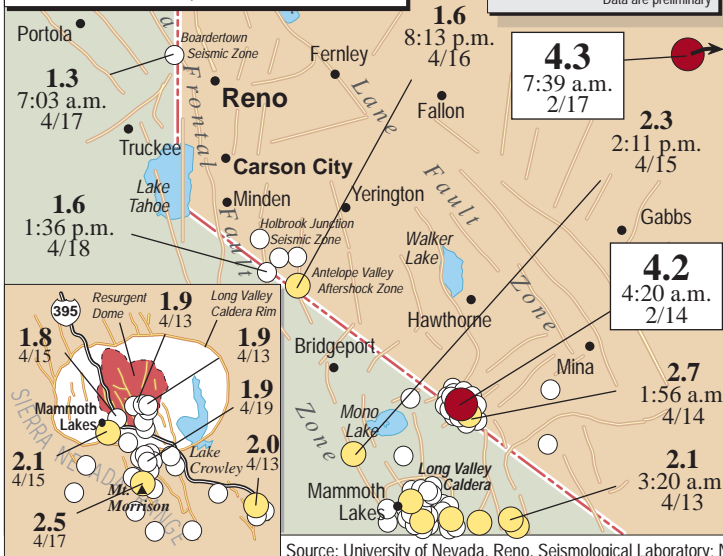
▼ **Regional Activity:** Two moderate earthquakes occurred in Nevada this past week. The first registered M4.2 and struck Monday, April 14, ENE of Mono Lake near the California/Nevada State line, in the Anchorite Hills. It was followed by 14 aftershocks, including one as large as M2.7. The second moderate temblor measured M4.3 occurred Thursday, April 17, about 30 miles south of Carlin in Upper Pine Valley. Although no reports have been received, it is likely both tremors were felt.

▼ A trio of M2s were recorded in Owens Valley near Bishop and a 2.3 triggered near Topaz Lake.

▼ **Mammoth Lakes Region:** Activity decreased. 28 events were detected, including three M2.0.
